5. Please comment on any aspect of this recitation.

21012. He seems a little frazzled sometimes, but I think he's a really great TA (and not a morning person) who is very knowledgeable and really just wants us to do well. I can tell he has put a lot of work into helping teach this class and I am very grateful that he is always accessible and happy to help.

24537. Tyler was fantastic and you could tell he tried very hard to make sure we found recitation helpful. He was constantly looking for ways to improve and seemed very invested in making recitation worth our time.

7172. TA is friendly but sometimes completes the questions using different methods that the professor did not teach in class. Since the TA writes all the recitation worksheets, the wording is a bit different than what we would normally see on the exam which the professor writes. These aspects made recitation a bit confusing sometimes.

7194. I think Tyler did a good job with the recitation. My only complaint is that the work space we were given below the questions was not large enough to fit the entire solution.

27918. I wish he reviewed the material ahead of time and sometimes he lost track of where we were in the class. He also didn't give a lot of space on his recitation papers which were a little on the advance side. On the bright side, he was very enthusiastic and willing to help and willing to explain things! He gave some extra side tips about how to solve math problems that were beneficial.

20973. He had a good understanding of the material; however, in the beginning of the semester, I was quite lost because he would use multiple Greek symbols and I had no clue what they referred to. Near the end of the semester, one of the discussion sections was about economics, yet I was totally lost despite knowing that the material we covered in class was simply applied to the field of economics. Overall, I think he was not necessarily a good guide during recitation as opposed to his act in office hours. We were mainly thrown the answers to the recitation problem set as opposed to actually reviewing the material.

21047. The problem sets were explained very well and he made sure to clear up any misconceptions and answer questions. Sometimes his explanations were a bit confusing because he would use different terminology than the ones used in lecture, but he would always clear that up by the end of the class.

24481. Generally very helpful in reviewing what was taught in lecture, but often was unable to cover everything that he had planned to cover

His explanations were just kind of all over the place, though, and I feel like he was apt to making things more complicated than they needed to be. 3698. Pretty helpful. Went a little overboard on explanations from time to time.
